

Dear Bishop Brady Parents,

Your teen will be taking the **SAT at school on Wednesday, October 14, 2020, during the regular school day**. The SAT is accepted at all U.S. colleges; it measures what students are learning in high school and what they need to know to succeed in college and career. We're pleased to offer SAT School Day to **Bishop Brady High School seniors** so that:

- Your teen is more comfortable and confident by testing in a familiar place.
- You don't have to worry about the logistics of getting your teen to a test center.
- No one has to worry about weekend conflicts or disrupting family time!

Seniors will **arrive at Bishop Brady High School at 8:00 AM and begin testing by 8:15 AM**. The SAT is approximately **four hours** long. This will be a **dress down day** for students and they will leave the building once they have finished their test.

The SAT measures students' **math, reading, and writing skills**. Along with the math, reading, and writing test, Bishop Brady requires students to complete an **essay portion** of the SAT. The SAT essay measures students' reading, writing and analysis skills. If students find themselves struggling with a multiple choice question, we encourage them to take their best educated guess as they will not be penalized for incorrect answers

Students are required to bring **two number 2 pencils** and are **encouraged to bring a scientific / graphing calculator for the math portion of the test**. You will find the link to the list of approved calculators at the bottom of this email. Students may bring a **water bottle**; however, **food will not be permitted**. Students are also **required to have cellphones shut off**. Lastly, we recommend students to get a great night's sleep and eat a nutritious breakfast.
